At UN, Civil Society Questions Pre-Screened on SDGs at HLPF, Austrian of IPU Says "Crazy"

UNITED NATIONS, July 19 – While the UN on its Sustainable Development Goals for three days this week held a "High Level Political Forum" in New York, when Inner City Press asked a panel of indigenous representatives on the first day about their rights to participate, the answer was discordant. It turns out that civil society could only question the Voluntary National Reports being presented by submitted questions in advance, to be pre-screened.

That is censorship, now too common at the UN.


While outgoing UN Department of Economic and Social Affairs official Wu Hongbo told Inner City Press the censorship was due to the limited size of the UN building, when Inner City Press asked an International Parliamentary Union panel on July 19, the answers were different.


